- 2) In the commands to not judge or condemn, what is Jesus communicating to His disciples?
- 3) Is Jesus saying that the student who still has much to learn is like a blind man?

Discussion Guide Questions

- 1) Have you ever been in a relationship (work, home, friends, church, etc.) where the relationship devolved into constant policing of someone's behavior? How did that situation come about, and what was the result of it?
- 2) What happens to a church body when policing one another's behavior becomes the normal way we interact? Does this tend to help the Body grow stronger or weaker and why?
- 3) In Jesus' day, the Pharisees had created an atmosphere of policing, criticizing, judging, and condemning people for the slightest infraction of their customs around the law. In Matthew 23:4, regarding the Pharisees, He says, "⁴ They tie up heavy, cumbersome loads and put them on other people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to lift a finger to move them."
 - i. Who has put a heavy load on your shoulders?
 - ii. On whose shoulders have you placed a heavy load?
- 4) When Jesus says, "Can the blind lead the blind?", He is making the point that people with a critical spirit are blind, and when they go around criticizing and judging everyone to make them change, they become "the blind leading the blind." What is the antidote to being one of these blind judges in this passage?
- 5) Jesus exhorts us to be generous with grace and forgiveness and to be fully trained in the ways of Christ before we go around trying to correct the people around us.
 - i. Why is generosity with grace and forgiveness needed before we start judging?
 - ii. Why do we need to be fully trained in the ways of Christ before we start judging?
- 6) God promises to judge us with the measure we use to judge others. This reminds us that those who generously pour out true mercy and grace are those who have truly received the mercy and grace of God in Christ Jesus. The key to being able to live out Jesus' commands here is to be a people who are always seeking to know the love, grace, and mercy of God more deeply. How can you practically grow in your knowledge of God's love, grace, and mercy this week?
