1)	How would you define the following words? a. Humility

2)	Write down the three major reasons for the existence of relational conflict in your life below, and think of an example that demonstrates the connection between the reason and the conflict: a. Reason / Connection 1:

	c. Reason / Connection 3:
3)	Jesus' mindset, or way thinking is both the epitome and perfection of humility and servanthood. Above, you described His mindset. When you think about adopting the mindset of Jesus Christ, what aspect is the most challenging? Why?
4)	Look at your reasons for conflict above. Do any of these have to do with your mindset? How would adopting Christ's mindset affect the conflicts you wrote about? Remember that even Jesus had conflict with people, so adopting His way of thinking will not get rid of all conflict, but it will change the way we experience conflict.
5)	When Jesus takes on the nature of a servant and endures the shame and agony of death on a cross, He lives out the greatest possible experience of servanthood and humility. For this, God exalts Him to the highest place and gives Him the name above every name. Apply this to someone struggling with the fear of being taken advantage of when they become a servant to others. How can that person be encouraged by Jesus' way of thinking and God's promise of exaltation? (See 1 Peter 5:6)
6)	Adopting the mindset of Christ requires that we be transformed in our minds by Him and that we act and actually humble ourselves while serving others. Commit to both being transformed and serving others this week. Write out any observations or revelations that came as you engaged in these two practices.
