## Regular Follow Up Questions

- 1) What truth about God did your heart most delight in?
- 2) Where did the gospel strengthen you?
- 3) What did the Lord convict you of?
- 4) What was your major application?
- 5) What new things have you learned in trying to live out your application?
- 6) How have your prayers been affected?

## Specific Follow Up Questions

- 1) When you think of the word “faith”, or “faithfulness”, what comes to mind? How do we often use these words?
- 2) It is easy to fall into the trap of thinking we must do “big” things to please God. If I go be a missionary across the world, become the next John Piper and speak at conferences, or write the next bestselling Christian living book, THEN God will be pleased with my faithfulness. Why do we often think we have to do big things to please God?
- 3) In Exodus 1-2, we see God’s hand working in many situations “behind the scenes” (not as noticeable as splitting the Red Sea). Where are some places in your life you have noticed God working behind the scenes?
- 4) Take some time as a group to come up with other examples in the Bible where we see small acts of faithfulness being regarded as true faith? (i.e. the woman washing Jesus’ feet with her hair)
- 5) What are some “small” things you can do at West Side that would make a big impact?
- 6) On Sunday, we brought up the fact that there is often a cost that comes with being faithful to God. What times in your life have you chosen faithfulness, and there was a cost? Was it worth it?
- 7) What are some ways you can build the idea of everyday faithfulness into the hearts of your children, grandchildren, or children you interact with if you do not have your own?
- 8) Everyday faithfulness is being faithful with what God has put in front of you. Spend some time praying for each other to be faithful in the small things.
