Regular Follow Up Questions

- 1) What truth about God did your heart most delight in?
- 2) Where did the gospel strengthen you?
- 3) What did the Lord convict you of?
- 4) What was your major application?
- 5) What new things have you learned in trying to live out your application?
- 6) How have your prayers been affected?

Specific Follow Up Questions

- 1) Why is love impossible to fake?
- 2) Who are your enemies? Or, to put it another way, who are the people that you have a hard time loving and why?
- 3) Sometimes it's easier for us to be mean to our so called “loved ones” than our actual enemies. Why do you think this is?
- 4) When we consider the true definition of love, we are often left thinking, “this is impossible for me to do.” How does God enable us to love as He loves?
- 5) What actions do you need to take in your personal walk with the Lord to grow your ability to love your enemies or even the loved ones you frequently fight with?
- 6) What attitude do you see in the news regarding discussions around matters of government?
- 7) How should Christians engage in discussion when talking about their viewpoint on volatile topics like abortion, gender, social services, etc.?
- 8) If we are “right” in our arguments but don't have love, what are we?
- 9) What does God want from us in our conversations around matters of government?
- 10) If Christians were known for how lovingly they talked about volatile issues, what might happen in our country?
