Regular Follow Up Questions

Specific Follow Up Questions

 - a. Why do you find their perspective, commentary, or reporting helpful?
 - b. Do they deal with controversial issues in a way that leads to more hostility or less hostility?
- 2) What sort of spiritual effect have these voices had in your life? Can you say with honesty that they have helped you to grow in love, good conscience, and faith?
- 3) We all need to get the news from some place. What are some good litmus tests we can use to see if a source is worth listening to?
- 4) Why do we find ourselves so easily caught up with teachers who thrive on controversy?
- 5) How can you help extract someone from a world where they've gotten hooked on listening to teachers who thrive on controversy?
